Involvement in Drag Racing:

ANDRA South Queensland Divisional Council consists of delegates with many years of experience as either a racer or crew member in all Groups of Racing in nearly all Brackets.

Proposal to Introduce Qualifying and Seeding System to Junior Dragster

To introduce qualifying to Junior Dragster based on class cut off's plus one tenth of a second.

- AJD – 8.00 seconds
- BJD – 8.60 seconds
- CJD – 12.00 seconds

Seeding for the bracket to be based on the closeness to their class index. i.e. A CJD car running 12.01 seconds will qualify higher than a AJD running 8.04 seconds.

Does the rule protect the safety of participants and spectators?

Nothing will change in regards to the safety regulations to the introduction of this rule.

Is the rule a positive step for the sport?

Yes, as of last season there has been no top qualifier for Junior Dragster with the introduction of the class system. This rule will

enable a competitor to aim for the top qualifying position within the bracket.

Is the impact of the rule on other classes and brackets a positive one? Does the rule insure opportunity for even competition?

Yes, in previous years because of racer restrictions (E.T) cars have been unable to compete for top qualifying honours. This rule will ensure that all vehicles in the bracket will be afforded a chance to top qualify or even qualify in the top half of the field.

Is the rule practical and enforceable?

Yes, it would take minimal effort to introduce this as a new seeding system for the Junior Dragster bracket. It will also give Restricted classes more chance to race all racers and not just the fastest in the entire bracket. i.e. cjd cars could race other cjd cars depending on their qualifying position.

Is the cost of complying with the rule reasonable for competitors?

There would be no change in cost to competitors for the introduction of this rule.
