

SFI Has Changed the Way Driver Restraints and Window/Roll Cage Nets are Dated for

SFI Specs 16.1, 16.2, 16.5, 16.6, 27.1, and 37.1





SFI Labels Prior to 2017

SFI Labels Available Jan. 1, 2017

- The New SFI Label Design (above right) removes the month/year date of manufacture and incorporates a single expiration date. This eliminates punch-dating and facilitates technical inspection in the field.
- New Labels will start being used January 1, 2017.
- New Labels will come out in 6-month segments per the below chart.
 Certified Driver Restraints and Window/Roll Cage Nets may still be used for 2 years, service life has not changed.

Manufacturers are allowed to use the discontinued punch-date labels (above left) until their existing supply is gone, so you may see the old style labels on Driver Restraints and Window/Roll Cage Nets for a while. Restraints or Nets with the old label can still be used until they expire, which is 2 years from the date of manufacture punched on the tag.
